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

Cleaning a Gloss Medium surface with water can re-moisten it enough to get cloudy, but not outright white. Filling in cracks is going to produce more thick/thin sections. I hope it works, but I'm a little afraid that your cracks may be filled with more cracks.

Anyway let everything cure until the cloudiness goes away. You have a lot of bubbles in there also. Try exhaling across the pour to pop the bubbles next time. Pour a very thin layer to fill the cracks. Let cure and go from there. Worst case scenario tear the river bed out and start over Yep done it and it hurts or very turbulent water flow if you can live with it. Gordon Spalty
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
