

By the time I saw the B&M around Newburyport, it had apparently been getting cinder ballast for at least 50 years, plus a topping from traffic on a fairly heavily used double track main. This is what you've seen me trying to model.Your main line is considerably newer, and was presumably built through a non-industrial landscape; on opening day any ballast would have been native gravel. Cinders and ash would accumulate from traffic. More cinders might come from engine terminal ash pits and hauling away ash from on-line industries, once they'd filled the grounds around the powerhouse.
